**23960-Golden Delicious \$29.99**

Rootstock: Geneva 935

Longtime favorite for its sweetness and flavor. Reliable producer, adapted to many climates. Pollenizer for Red Delicious. Mid-season harvest (September in Central Calif.). Self-fruitful.

**59580-Honeycrisp-\$29.99**

Rootstock: Geneva 935

Fruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

**59582-Liberty -\$29.99**

Rootstock: Geneva 935

Disease-resistant, cold hardy apple. Resists scab, rust, mildew, fire blight. Solid red even in hot climate. Crisp, rich sprightly flavor. Fresh or cooked. Early fall harvest. Interfruitful with Red Delicious, Empire, McIntosh. Self-fruitful.

**13475-Akane- \$28.99**

Rootstock: Molling 111

Especially fine red dessert apple derived from Jonathan. Sweet, rich, spicy flavor-well-regarded by apple connoisseurs. resists scab and powdery mildew. Harvest in early season (August). Pollenizer required: Fuji, Gala, Granny Smith, Golden Delicious.

**13495-Ashmead's Kernel-\$28.99**

Rootstock: Molling 111

. Widely regarded as one of the all-time best-flavored apples. Small to medium-sized fruit; variable shape, often lop-sided. Greenish to golden brown russet skin with reddish

highlights. Creamy yellow flesh is aromatic, crisp and sweet. Fruit picked early is somewhat sharp and acidic, but mellows after a few weeks off the tree. Ripens after Red Delicious, about with Golden Delicious. Keeps 3-4 months. Used for dessert, cider and sauce. Resistant to powdery mildew, somewhat resistant to apple scab. Winter hardy tree, begins bearing at young age. From England, discovered in the early 1700s. Partly self-fruitful, biggest crops with cross-pollination.

**33338-Belle de Boskoop-\$28.99**

Rootstock: Molling 111

Large, greenish yellow fruit with dark red blush. Rough Skin. Crisp, tangy, highly aromatic flesh. Outstanding for dessert, cooking and baking. Sweetens in storage. Excellent keeper. Needs a pollinator. Ripens in November or December. Favorite in England.

**13510-Cox Orange Pippin \$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Regarded by the British as the finest flavored dessert apple. Medium size, conical fruit with rather dull finish; red stripes over thin, tough, smooth orange skin. Firm, tender, juicy, aromatic, yellow flesh. Distinctive flavor; mellow aftertaste and unsurpassed aroma. Excellent processing apple for desserts, pies, cooking and cider. Keeps from October to January. Blooms late. Ripens from mid-September to Mid-October.

**13515-Empire-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

McIntosh type with better color and flavor, longer shelf life and refrigerated keeping ability. Medium size, round, firmer, darker waxy fruit. Creamy white, crisp, juicy, moderately sub acid flesh. High quality dessert apple, also good for cider. Vigorous, early bearing tree. Needs some thinning, best with pollinator.

**13530-Fuji \$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

California's favorite apple. High quality apple, with a not so pretty appearance. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin, sometimes russeted. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

**13520-Fuji, Red \$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Redder-skinned bud sport of Fuji. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Ripe September-October in Central Calif. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

**98808-Gala-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Wonderful dessert apple from New Zealand. Crisp, nice blend of sweetness and tartness, rich flavor. Skin reddish-orange over yellow. Early harvest. Good pollinizer for other

varieites. Adapted to cold and warm-winter climates. Self-fruitful.

**13555-Golden Delicious -\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Longtime favorite for its sweetness and flavor. Reliable producer, adapted to many climates. Pollenizer for Red Delicious. Mid-season harvest (September in Central Calif.). Self-fruitful.

**10010-Granny Smith-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Large, waxy, grass-green fruit; firm and bruise resistant. Hardy, crisp, juicy, white flesh. Moderately sweet, snappy flavor. Superb eating and cooking qualities. Keeps good texture during baking; never gets mushy. Keeps 180 days in cold storage. Good shelf life. Very vigorous; annual and early bearing. Strong grower and tip bearer; very heavy producer. Self-fertile. Unusually long season; harvest 170-190 days after full bloom. Holds well in heat.

**13575-Gravenstein Red-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Famous for sauce and baking, also used fresh. Crisp, juicy, flavorful, tart. Early bloom, early harvest. Green with red stripes. Pollen-sterile, pollenizer required: Empire, Fuji, Gala, Red Delicious.

**12574-Honeycrisp-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Fruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

**83037-Hudsons Golden Gem-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Large, high quality russet. Conical, elongated fruit. Smooth, dull yellow russet skin; very long stem. Sugary, juicy, crisp flesh. Flavor is somewhat nutty. Excellent dessert apple. Keeps in storage for three months. Hangs on tree well into winter. Good disease resistance

**55384-Jonathon, Red-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Deep red strain of Jonathan. Flesh is white, juicy, and tangy. Excellent for eating fresh, cider and keeps well. Requires pollenizer such as Yellow Delicious.

**13600-King, Thompkins-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Large, old-time red-striped apple with classic apple flavor. Its coarse, crisp flesh is subacid, sweet and distinctly perfumed. Used for dessert, cooking and cider. Well-

colored fruits are a very attractive red with some contrasting yellow. Fairly rectangular shape, with ribs near the base. Ripens mid-season, about with Golden Delicious. Keeps several months, but at its best soon after harvest. Horizontal limbs, spreading growth habit. Originated in New Jersey prior to 1804. Sterile pollen; cross-pollination required.

**13605-Liberty -\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Disease-resistant, cold hardy apple. Resists scab, rust, mildew, fire blight. Solid red even in hot climate. Crisp, rich sprightly flavor. Fresh or cooked. Early fall harvest. Interfruitful with Red Delicious, Empire, McIntosh. Self-fruitful.

**23586-Melrose -\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Large, dark red and green apple. Firm coarse, juicy, creamy white flesh. Slight acid flavor. Very good cooking and dessert quality. Best for eating after Christmas when it develops its fruity aroma. Can store until April. Good pollinator.

**13615-Mutsu Crispin-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Yellow Delicious type. Large, round, yellow fruit. Crunchier flesh, more juice and tartness. Distinctive, delicate spicy flavor; faintly anise-like. Good dessertFruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

**13625-Pink Lady (Cripps Pink)-\$31.99**

Rootstock: M111

New hot climate apple from Western Australia. Very crisp, sweet-tart, distinct flavor, good keeper. Skin reddish-pink over green when ripe. White flesh resists browning. Harvest begins late October in Central CA, about three weeks after Fuji. Self-fruitful.

**27726-Pink Pearl-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Pink fleshed variety developed from Surprise. Medium size apple with attractive cream and green skin. Sometimes blushed with red cheek. Novel, bright pink flesh. Rich, sweet flavor; fine aroma. Good dessert quality, makes colorful pies and apple sauce. Short term storage ability. Needs pollinator: Golden Delicious, Fuji, Gala would work well. Developed by Albert Etter in 1944.

**98814-Waltana-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Medium to large fruit of variable shape. Thin red striping over greenish background. Often picked on the green side and ripened in storage. Crisp, hard, yet juicy texture. Vigorous and productive. Ripens in November here on the coast. Al Albert Etter variety named for Albert's brother, Walter, and his wife. Introduced in 1860

**28914-Yellow Bellflower-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Large fruit, elongated, often lopsided shape. Lemon yellow with conspicuous white or russet dots; often blushed with pink. Crisp, firm, medium fine grained, medium tender, cream colored flesh. Sweet slightly sub acid flavor. Good for fresh eating, pies and sauce. Pick on tart side and will mellow after storage. Needs pollinator. Ripens October. Since 1742.

**98817-Yellow Newton Pippin-\$28.99**

Rootstock: M111

Newtown Pippin is one of the oldest American apple varieties, being well-known in the 18th century and probably raised as a seedling by early settlers on Long Island. It is an all American Apple since before 1750. Also called the Albemarle Pippin. It's a winter apple and holds onto the tree well into the winter months. Best stored for 1-2 months before eating. Can be used for cooking, juicing and even hard cider. Holds its shaped well when cooked. Requires pollinating from Yellow Delicious or Fuji.

**55388-Zestar - \$33.99**

Rootstock: M111

An early apple that is crisp and juicy. Best known for its excellent sweet tart flavor with a hint of brown sugar. It ripens in late August to late September. Apples remain crisp for 2 months in refrigeration. Requires pollenizer such as Yellow Delicious

Fruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

#### **13655-Harglow - \$28.99**

Rootstock: Citation 5/8" caliper

Late-blooming, productive tree, proven in coastal Northwestern climates. Medium size, bright orange fruit sometimes blushed red. Orange freestone flesh is firm, sweet flavorful. Resistant to perennial canker, brown rot, cracking. Self-fruitful.

#### **28272-Puget Gold - \$26.99**

Rootstock: Citation 1" caliper

Proven producer of large, flavorful fruit in Western Washington. Recommended for other western climates where spring rains and frosts limit apricot culture. Harvest early August. 600 hours. Self-fruitful. USDA Zones 6-9.

#### **83061-Tomcot - \$33.99**

Rootstock: Citation 1" caliper

A consistently productive apricot variety. Large, orange fruit with firm, sweet flesh. Slightly tart, old-time apricot flavor. Early harvest, 2 - 3 weeks before Wenatchee Moorpark. Introduced in 1989. 500 hours or less. Partly self-fruitful, largest crops if cross-pollinized by another apricot.

#### **59588-Summer Delight - \$33.99**

Rootstock: Citation 3/4" caliper

Late-season Aprium, ripe late July-Early August. Reliable bearer, great apricot flavor very juicy flesh. Self-fruitful, required chill 500 hours or less, best in zones 7-10 U.S. (Zaiger)

### **Cherries Sweet Dwarf**

---

#### **35936-Lapins \$32.99**

Rootstock: New Root

Introduced from Canada. This is becoming the replacement tree for Bings. Firm fruit as large as Bings. Excellent quality and rich flavor. Crack resistant. Heavy producer. Self-fertile. Resists late frosts. Ripens late July.

#### **62618-Stella \$36.99**

Rootstock: New Root

Self-fruitful - no pollinizer needed. Large, nearly black, richly flavored sweet cherry similar to its parent, Lambert. Late harvest. 400 hours. Pollinates Bing, except in mild winter climates. USDA Zones 5-9.

---

### **Cherries Sweet Semi-Dwarf**

---

#### **27752-Bada Bing \$31.99**

Rootstock: Colt

Large. Bing-like Cherry. Dark red skin. Purplish red flesh is firm and sweet. Best known as a "self-fertile Bing". Resistant to cracking. Good pollinizer for other sweet cherries.

Ripens: Late season, 1-2 weeks after Bing

**13745-Bing \$31.99**

Rootstock: Colt

Large, firm, juicy, sweet, nearly black when ripe — superb flavor, the No. 1 cherry. Mid-season. Large vigorous tree. Pollinated by Black Tartarian, Van, Rainier. Also Stella in colder climates.

**82362-Lapins \$31.99**

Rootstock: Colt

Self-fruitful, dark red, sweet cherry. Large, firm texture, good flavor. Similar to Bing.

**Cherry's Sour**

---

**66886 English Morello-\$26.99**

Rootstock: Mazzard

Late-ripening tart cherry for cooking, sometimes eaten fresh when fully ripe. Dark red to nearly black fruit with dark juice. Small, round-headed tree with drooping branches (easy to harvest). European origins obscure, introduced to America prior to 1862. 500 hours or less. Self-fruitful. USDA Zones 4-9.

**13770-Montmorency \$28.99**
