59580-Honeycrisp-\$34.99

Rootstock: Geneva 935

Fruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

59582-Liberty -\$34.99

Rootstock: Geneva 935

Disease-resistant, cold hardy apple. Resists scab, rust, mildew, fire blight. Solid red even in hot climate. Crisp, rich sprightly flavor. Fresh or cooked. Early fall harvest. Interfruitful with Red Delicious, Empire, McIntosh. Self-fruitful.

Apples Semi-Dwarf

13475-Akane- \$31.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Especially fine red dessert apple derived from Jonathan. Sweet, rich, spicy flavor-well-regarded by apple connoisseurs. resists scab and powdery mildew. Harvest in early season (August). Pollenizer required: Fuji, Gala, Granny Smith, Golden Delicious.

13495-Ashmead's Kernel-\$31.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

. Widely regarded as one of the all-time best-flavored apples. Small to medium-sized fruit; variable shape, often lop-sided. Greenish to golden brown russet skin with reddish highlights. Creamy yellow flesh is aromatic, crisp and sweet. Fruit picked early is

somewhat sharp and acidic, but mellows after a few weeks off the tree. Ripens after Red Delicious, about with Golden Delicious. Keeps 3-4 months. Used for dessert, cider and sauce. Resistant to powdery mildew, somewhat resistant to apple scab. Winter hardy tree, begins bearing at young age. From England, discovered in the early 1700s. Partly self-fruitful, biggest crops with cross-pollination.

33338-Belle de Boskoop-\$31.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

Large, greenish yellow fruit with dark red blush. Rough Skin. Crisp, tangy, highly aromatic flesh. Outstanding for dessert, cooking and baking. Sweetens in storage. Excellent keeper. Needs a pollinator. Ripens in November or December. Favorite in England.

33338-Braeburn-\$31.99

Rootstock: Molling 111

From New Zealand. Superb late season fruit: very crisp and tangy, more flavorful than Granny Smith. Excellent keeper. Green with dark red blush. October-November harvest. 700 hours. Self-fruitful.

13510-Cox Orange Pippin \$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Regarded by the British as the finest flavored dessert apple. Medium size, conical fruit with rather dull finish; red stripes over thin, tough, smooth orange skin. Firm, tender, juicy, aromatic, yellow flesh. Distinctive flavor; mellow aftertaste and unsurpassed aroma. Excellent processing apple for desserts, pies, cooking and cider. Keeps from October to January. Blooms late. Ripens from mid-September to Mid-October.

74170-Cinnamon Spice \$51.99 (Trees of Antiquity Organic Apple)

Rootstock: M111

This tree was discovered in the small reclusive town of Bolinas, CA by Jesse Schwartz. At the time nobody could identify this delicious apple so it was named Cinnamon Spice for its rich, distinct cinnamon flavor, tastes similar to an apple pie. Exceptionally sweet, medium in size, wine-red fruit with some yellow hue. Tree of medium vigor, with upright shoots. Good disease resistance. The Cinnamon Spice does well in coastal influences as well as many southern states. Originally named Laxtons Fortune. Cider, Cooking / Sauces, Fresh Eating. Midseason. Needs pollinator: Golden Delicious, Gala, Fuji

13515-Empire-\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

McIntosh type with better color and flavor, longer shelf life and refrigerated keeping ability. Medium size, round, firmer, darker waxy fruit. Creamy white, crisp, juicy, moderately sub acid flesh. High quality dessert apple, also good for cider. Vigorous, early bearing tree. Needs some thinning, best with pollinator.

13530-Fuji \$31.99

Rootstock: M111

California's favorite apple. High quality apple, with a not so pretty appearance. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Dull reddish-orange skin, sometimes russeted. Ripe mid-September. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

13520-Fuji, Red \$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Redder-skinned bud sport of Fuji. Sweet, very crisp and flavorful, excellent keeper. Ripe September-October in Central Calif. Excellent pollinizer for other apple varieties. Self-fruitful.

98808-Gala-\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Wonderful desert apple from New Zealand. Crisp, nice blend of sweetness and tartness, rich flavor. Skin reddish-orange over yellow. Early harvest. Good pollinizer for other varieties. Adapted to cold and warm-winter climates. Self-fruitful.

13555-Golden Delicious -\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Longtime favorite for its sweetness and flavor. Reliable producer, adapted to many climates. Pollinizer for Red Delicious. Mid-season harvest (September in Central Calif.). Self-fruitful.

74174-Goldrush -\$51.99 (Trees of Antiquity Organic Apple) 1973

Rootstock: M111

Goldrush apple is crisp and juicy, with a complex, spicy, sweet-tart flavor that mellows over time. Goldrush is a late season apple, medium, round to conical, golden yellow with an orange-red blush. An all purpose apple enjoyed fresh, pressed for cider, and chopped in salads, since it's slow to brown. Goldrush stores exceptionally well. Great selection for organic growers since the trees are very disease resistant. If you're curious its parentage is a handful of classic apples; Golden Delicious, Melrose, Rome Beauty, Siberian Crab and Winesap. Fresh Eating, Cider, Desserts / Pies, Cooking / Sauces, Canning / Preserves

74176-Golden Russet-\$51.99 (Trees of Antiquity Organic Apple) 1845

Rootstock: M111

Recently home gardens and small orchards have renewed interest in the Golden Russet for its distinctive appearance and intense flavor. The "champagne" of old-time cider apples, also delicious for eating and drying. Grey-green to golden bronze with a coppery orange cheek; heavily splotched with light brown russet. Crisp, highly flavored, fine-textured, yellow flesh makes very sugary juice. They are high in both sugar, acid and tannins, which make them a good pair with almost any apple for eating, cooking or cider. Golden Russet shows some resistance to scab and cedar apple rust. Cider, Fresh Eating
Needs Pollinator: Yellow Delicious, Fuji, Gala, Granny Smith

10010-Granny Smith-\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Large, waxy, grass-green fruit; firm and bruise resistant. Hardy, crisp, juicy, white flesh. Moderately sweet, snappy flavor. Superb eating and cooking qualities. Keeps good texture during baking; never gets mushy. Keeps 180 days in cold storage. Good shelf life. Very vigorous; annual and early bearing. Strong grower and tip bearer; very heavy producer. Self-fertile. Unusually long season; harvest 170-190 days after full bloom. Holds well in heat.

13575-Gravenstein Red-\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Famous for sauce and baking, also used fresh. Crisp, juicy, flavorful, tart. Early bloom, early harvest. Green with red stripes. Pollen-sterile, pollinizer required: Empire, Fuji, Gala, Red Delicious.

74180-Hauer Pippin-\$51.99 (Trees of Antiquity Organic Apple) 1890

Rootstock: M111

If you want a large, crisp, dense, juicy, sweet, vinous, aromatic very late apple the Hauer Pippin is the tree to plant. The Hauer Pippin is one of last apples to leave the orchard, a trait that earned it the nickname "Christmas Apple" in its heyday a hundred years ago. Hauer Pippin is thought to be a hybrid of a famous English apple, the Cox Orange Pippin, and a Yellow Bellflower since both varieties were growing nearby where the original seedling was discovered in Santa Cruz in 1890's. Green with an orange blush and white spots. Great multi-purpose apple, best as a dessert apple, keeps flavor and shape when cooked also juicy with sharpness for well balanced cider. Some resistance to coddling moth and scab. Requires Pollinator: Fuji, Liberty, Golden Delicious,

54926-Honeycrisp-\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Fruit is mottled red over yellow. Very crisp flesh. Excellent eating and keeping qualities. Rated superior to McIntosh and Delicious for fresh eating. Keeps up to five months in common storage. Ripens late September to October.

13600-King, Thompkins-\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Large, old-time red-striped apple with classic apple flavor. Its coarse, crisp flesh is subacid, sweet and distinctly perfumed. Used for dessert, cooking and cider. Well-colored fruits are a very attractive red with some contrasting yellow. Fairly rectangular shape, with ribs near the base. Ripens mid-season, about with Golden Delicious. Keeps several months, but at its best soon after harvest. Horizontal limbs, spreading growth habit. Originated in New Jersey prior to 1804. Sterile pollen; cross-pollination required.

74182-Kingston Black-\$51.99 (Trees of Antiquity Organic Apple) 1820

Rootstock: M111

Kingston Black apple, also known as Black Taunton, is crimson over yellow-orange ground color. Bitter sharp juice ferments to a distinctively flavored hard cider without

blending. These are aromatic with a sweet-acid flavor and a noticeable astringent aftertaste. The full bodied cider has a distinctive rich flavor and is rich bodied. Kingston Black has an irregular growth habit. Cider only, except for the very brave. Pollinator required: Golden Delicious, Granny Smith

13605-Liberty -\$31.99

Rootstock: M111

Disease-resistant, cold hardy apple. Resists scab, rust, mildew, fire blight. Solid red even in hot climate. Crisp, rich sprightly flavor. Fresh or cooked. Early fall harvest. Interfruitful with Red Delicious, Empire, McIntosh. Self-fruitful.

23586-Melrose -\$31.99

Rootstock: M111
